What are some verbs that describe an upward trend? rise; jump; grow;

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climb; go up; increase; soar (soar = to increase rapidly above the normal level) What are some verbs that describe a downward trend? fall; drop; decline; decrease; go down; plunge; plummet; Plummet and plunge both mean to suddenly decrease in a very rapid and almost straight down way.

Useful Phrases for Task 1 reports. showed an upward trend / showed a downward trend. hit the highest point / hit the lowest point. reached a peak / showed some fluctuation / fluctuated wildly. remained stable / remained static / remained unchanged / stayed constant. reached a plateau / levelled off / flattened out.

IELTS Writing Task 1: Language for describing trends

Do not describe every small upwards or downwards movement. You need to look at the important trends or characteristics and give a general overview. You will normally use verbs in the past tense when describing trends though always look for dates to confirm which tense to use. Do not write about things that do not appear in the graph. You shouldn't give an opinion, just describe the information that appears.
